At EFL we want to equip recent matriculants for their futures by providing a well-rounded, bible-based programme that will disciple students in following Christ, not only in word, but in a practical, relevant, day to day manner.

The students will be equipped in three main focus areas: HEAD, HEART and HANDS. Each of these represent an area of growth that we all need to develop throughout our lives to be informed, loving and contributing members of society. HEAD represents the academic portion of the programme that occurs through courses and reading. HEART represents the spiritual discipleship and personal growth portion of the programme that occurs through serving, mentorship and courses. HANDS represents the practical life skills development for all those things that they never taught you at school but are integral to life.

HOW DO I APPLY?

• Step 1:

• Step 2:

• Step 3:

Ensure accompanying documentation (listed in the application form) are complete and present.
